“300 ROSES” will stylistically look and feel like Miami Vice, but instead of fighting drug trafficking, our heroes will be fighting human trafficking.

Set against the backdrop of the streets and causeways of Miami, to the Colombian city by the sea of Cartagena, to the underground sub-culture of Prague, Kiev and Amsterdam, 300 ROSES was created to shine a stark, white-hot spotlight on the subject of human trafficking, through the art of generationally defining storytelling, by Academy Award winning talent.

300 ROSES will push the limits of conventional mainstream episodic television, depicting the truth of what is actually happening today in every country on the planet, and how a small group of real-life superheroes are giving their lives to try and stop it.
